Transportation:

ASU U-PASS offers 9 months of unlimited rides (Academic Year Pass) at a cost of \$200 and is valid on the Valley Metro light rail and on Local, LINK, Express and RAPID Valley Metro bus routes. This is a significant savings compared to the Valley Metro's monthly Express pass, which offers the same level of service as the U-Pass and costs \$104 per month or \$936 for an academic year. - Free instruction and tutorials on performing your own basic bike maintenance
- Car racks and night riding lights for daily checkout (Polytechnic)
- Skateboard adjustments, repairs, bearing lube
